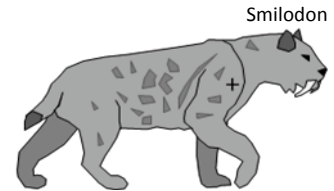


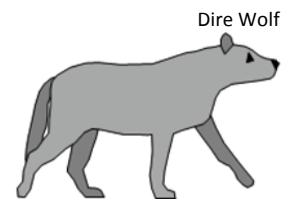
WHAT ICE AGE ANIMAL AM I?

DRAW A LINE FROM THE CLUES ON THE LEFT TO MATCH THE ICE AGE ANIMALS ON THE RIGHT.

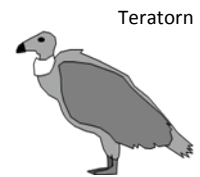
- I am a herbivore over 2 metres tall. Scientists aren't sure whether I had a hump.



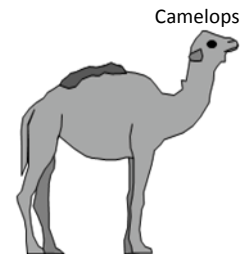
- My name means "Great Beast". I have a very long tongue and five sharp claws on each foot. Even though I am about the size of an elephant, I can still stand on my hind legs.



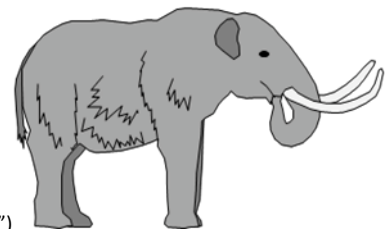
- My name means "Nipple Teeth". I have a thick coat of shaggy hair and tusks that can be over 5 metres long, used to fight and break branches. I lived in North America.



- I have short muscular legs and a short neck and tail. My canines can be 30cm long and are used for stabbing prey. I can weigh over 500kg and be up to 2.6m long.



- I hunt in packs. I kill my prey with lots of shallow bites. My legs are short and sturdy and I can weigh up to 110kg.



Mammut Americanum ("Mastadon")

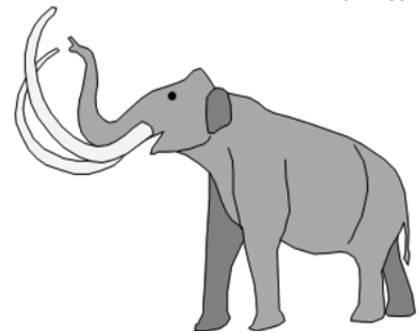
- My name means "monster bird". My wingspan is up to 3.8 metres long. I am a bird of prey – I swallow animals whole! I am related to the Condor.

- My name means “Great Roamer” and I lived in Australia. I have serrated, blade-like teeth and heavily built limbs and body. I was the largest land lizard known to have existed.

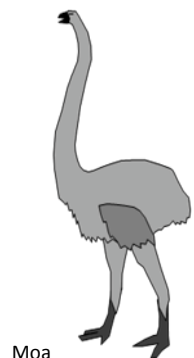


- I have little wings and big drumsticks! I lived in New Zealand and am a herbivore who swallowed gizzard stones.

Woolly Rhinoceros



- I am a large armoured mammal the size of a small car and a relative of the armadillo. My name means “Grooved Tooth”.



Moa

- I am a herbivore with short legs and thick long fur. There are two horns on my skull made of keratin. One horn can be up to one metre long. The smaller horn is between my eyes.

Megalania (Giant Monitor Lizard)



- I am a close relative of the modern elephant. I had long curved tusks. Some of us had long hair. My name has become an adjective meaning “large” or “massive”.
